




















Members' websites

Midjourney surprise

The RPS E. Midlands online talk from Jane Goodall last week was very interesting. The AI tool **Midjourney** is quite addictive, it seems.

Leaving aside the AI/photography controversy, I made an interesting discovery from the presentation. We knew that this works by creating text prompts which then generate images, but I hadn't realised you could upload a picture and it would provide several descriptions.

I had sent in an image, as we'd been invited to, and the suggestion had been to make it a fairly close-up portrait. I had forgotten about it until the last minute (as ever!) so grabbed one of Stewart that I did a few years ago.

Towards the end of the session Jane popped in some prompts for other portraits which were interesting to see. I was expecting to see perhaps Stewart on another planet (no change there!) but instead, Jane used the Describe function to create 4 different descriptions which you can see here.

As the photographer, I was pretty chuffed with 'award-winning', 'portraiture with emotion' and 'caravaggism', though 'sovietwave' surprised me! Model Stewart preened a tad at 'intriguingly taboo', 'gothic

National Portrait Gallery reopening 22 June

Three years after its closure for refurbishment, the **National Portrait Gallery** is set to reopen on **22 June** – with photography firmly at the centre. The idea is to make the institution more welcoming for London's visitors.

In the galleries, <u>Yevonde: Life</u> and <u>Colour</u> presents the NPG-purchased archive of the pioneering portraitist. "Yevonde used to say that colour photography didn't really have a history, so you had to reach inside."


